


A LOT

- Record Observations in the NC Bird Atlas Portal: Birds observed or heard from your backyard, farm, or favorite local park.
- Review <u>bird breeding</u>
 <u>behavior codes</u> and add
 them to your observations in
 eBird.
- Collect data in a Priority
 <u>Block</u>: Record all birds
 observed and heard, while
 keeping trips to <1 mile and
 <1 hour in length.
- Adopt a block(s) and become the primary Atlaser.
- Explore all habitat within a Priority Block and make repeat trips.
- With a partner conduct nocturnal surveys within a priority block.
